

CHAIRMAN'S REMARKS

Juan, Two, Three Strikes You're Out"! Not members of Friends though, Many were on base first thing after the hurricane! Many thanks to Paul Sampson of Department of Public Works and Transport (DoTPW) on ensuring the necessary repairs needed were done as soon as possible. As Chairman, I was immediately hard at work trying to raise funds for the immediate repairs. Ian Lawyer of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) has advised us, however, that no funds were available since the Provincial Parks and the Metro area were damaged extensively. Clearly, the logs placed during the year thanks to Bowater, DoTPW and DNR helped save the dunes but obviously more armour rock is needed. This is slated to become a new and probably on-going project.

Many of us were surprised and pleased to see the swiftness with which the Department of Transport repaired and widened the road to Bush Island. This extra space may alleviate the parking, but we recognize it creates a need for some way to provide safe access over the dunes to the beach, perhaps at several points. The Beach Committee is currently addressing this question.

The Beach Projects that you read about in our

last Newsletter and heard at the AGM in August are going ahead as planned. Bruce Raymond has reported to the Board that the fence post placement has been completed. Installation of Interpretative Panels with art work by Don Pentz. is on schedule according to Linda MacDonald.

Other Board members keep busy with on-going work. Burpee Meisner has just finished a successful membership drive and Captain Bell continues his efforts to clarify the legal situation at Sperry's Beach.

The Board has indeed been working hard on your behalf, and we hope that any of you who have not yet done so will renew your Annual Membership.

Crescent Beach Action Plan "To respect is to protect"

In September 2001, Friends instituted an Action Plan with five major components. The scientific study and the recycling bins projects were completed during 2002. Progress during 2003 on the remaining items include:

- 1. Restoration of the revetment (the wooden cribwork protecting the dune). The crib was installed many years ago and was becoming unsightly, quite dilapidated, and a hazard. Its repair has been financed by using funds raised by Friends. Hemlock logs, donated by Bowater, were sliced into 3-inch thick rough "planks". To replace rotten, damaged or missing planks, several hundred of the new planks were fastened to the posts which had been previously repaired. The work was done over a month-long period in the spring by Department of Transportation and Public Works (DoTPW) staff.
- 2. Roadside parking. Vegetation is the very best method of maintaining the dune which is essential to the preservation of the beach. A series of posts has been installed along the roadside to localize parking and so contain the damaging pedestrian traffic over the dunes to selected locations. This is intended to favour the growth of vegetation along the remainder of the dune. The posts were installed as part of a DoTPW contract, once again funded by Friends.
- 3. Installation of interpretive signs We intend to install two attractive interpretive signs this year. Local artist Donald Pentz is providing paintings of many of the birds seen in the beach, marsh and dunes.



Hurricane Juan

On September 28, with a hurricane expected. Bob Taylor (beach specialist for Geological Survey of Canada) requested that Friends observe and report on its effects. He had previously stated that the dunes have been slowly rebuilding over the last several years. On September 29, damage done by Hurricane Juan was revealed. Heavy seas had attacked the beach and waves washed over the top of the dunes, particularly toward the west end of the beach. Several inches of sand were deposited on parts of the road, and, in a few limited areas. the dune was washed through. The recycling bin at the west end of the beach was pushed back several feet from its position near the road shoulder and partially tipped over the bank behind. (A Friends volunteer crew has since restored it to its rightful place.) The fill supporting the salt flats side of the road was also attacked so that the edge of the pavement was in peril, and was promptly repaired by DoTPW. An after-storm set of sand depth readings, part of the on-going Friends beach monitoring program, were provided to Mr. Taylor. See 'Friends on the Web', below for two sites providing pictures of the damage. In general, the revetment withstood the onslaught and obviously provided dune protection by dissipating some of the energy of the waves. Most of the work done in the spring held up well although some of the older portions suffered. Six posts damaged or displaced must be replaced and about 230 new planks must be installed. It is intended to use planks we stored after the spring work for these repairs.

There was greater damage done to the dune at the areas where the revetment broke down. The protective value of vegetation was also well illustrated: the worst wash-throughs occurred where the dune was bare. At other locations, where there had been a significant growth of marram grass on the ocean side of the revetment, the sand had obviously been preserved while adjoining areas without grass were badly eroded.

Future Plans

Friends must now look at possible future projects to restore the beach including the addition of further armour rock, clean-up of debris deposited or uncovered by the storm, repair of the revetment, review of the proposed parking and pedestrian access areas, and encouragement of vegetation on the dune. DNR, which provided some of the funding for the work in spring 2003 is now faced with heavy expenses for hurricane restoration in other areas of the province hit even harder than Crescent Beach. It appears that Friends will have to arrange funding for this future work.

<u>History Project</u> Memories of Crescent Beach?

Crescent Beach promises to be busier than ever this coming summer as celebrations occur in honour of the 400th anniversary of Samuel de Champlain's anchorage and exploration of Green Bay and area. His extraordinary map of Crescent Beach is the first representation of our sandy strand and shows us that much remains the



same as it then was. Champlain's explorations led to French settlements around the bay and at the mouth of the LaHave River. This summer the third Acadian World Congress also comes to Nova Scotia and events are already being planned to celebrate the French heritage here.

Indeed such important events as Champlain's landing are historically significant, but we sometimes forget that history happens to all of us and slips away all too readily if we don't record it. Friends board member Captain Doug Bell has written an excellent summary of the history of Crescent Beach from 1755 - 1951. In August, Olga Maxwell turned over to Friends archival information on the LaHave Islands Community Association from 1977.

Interviews with Francis Romkey and John West this past year have led to some delightful stories of Crescent Beach in the early decades of the 20^{th} century. As well, last spring, students at the Petite School under teacher Jesse Hache put together a collection of further memories.

Does your family have stories, photos, postcards, or other memorabilia of the Beach? We would love to hear from you. Friends is working to put together a brief history of Crescent Beach, complete with pictures, sometime in the near future. Photos, postcards, and other archival material will be scanned and returned, or entrusted to the LaHave Islands Marine Museum on Bell Island.
